The History of Judaism

Judaism is a religion that began in Mesopotamia also known as the Middle East.

Those who follow Judaism are called Jews or Hebrews. Today, Israel is a nation in the Middle East that was established as a safe haven for Jewish people after World War II.

Israel has the largest population of Jews in the world. The United States has the second largest population



The story of Judaism is told in their holy book, The Torah, which Christians and Muslims also share. Christians refer to those books containing Jewish history as the Old Testament.

Judaism was founded by Abraham. He is considered to be the father of Judaism. When God spoke to Abraham he made a covenant (promise) with him that if Abraham and his people would always obey and only worship God, in return God would always protect them.

From this early promise Jews became known as "God's chosen people." Not because He favored them over others but because according to the Torah they accepted Him when all other people on Earth rejected Him for false gods.

Hebrews became one of the earliest cultures to be monotheistic, or to believe in only one God.


The God of the Hebrews was VERY different from the surrounding cultures which were polytheistic. Those cultures found it hard to believe that any one God could look after everyone and still get the work of the world done. Their gods were generally tied to one location, sometimes too busy to worry about regular people and only looked after people living in their region.

The God of the Hebrews was:

- -Omnipotent (all powerful)
- -Omnipresent (present everywhere)
- -Omniscient (all knowing)

Abraham was not just the father of Judaism he also influenced its early beliefs and exemplifies total dedication to his beliefs. Can you identify the story from the Torah that is depicted below?






The Hebrews worked their land, worshipped, until one day all their crops died.... sad times... so God instructed them to move to Egypt!
